<b>NEW COURSE NUMBER</b>	<b>COURSE TITLE AND DESCRIPTION</b>	<b>CONTACT HOURS</b>
<b>CONT160</b>	<b>INTRODUCTION TO THE UPHOLSTERY INDUSTRY</b> Participants will learn how to successfully complete the next four years of apprenticeship from the training center staff. They will learn what will be expected of them from the training center, the local union, the benefits office, and on the job site.	28
<b>SFHT260</b>	<b>SAFETY FOR UPHOLSTERY WORKERS I</b> Participants will be introduced to the safety standards and potential hazards of the industry. Participants will receive training in First Aid/CPR/AED. They will also be required to complete OSHA 10 as part of this course. Students are also introduced to PPE and other important aspects of safety on the job sight.	60
<b>CONT161</b>	<b>MATERIALS AND FASTENERS</b> Participants will be introduced to furniture frames, adhesives and fasteners, padding, springs, and twine.	32
<b>CONT162</b>	<b>TOOLS AND EQUIPMENT</b> Participants will be introduced to common tools, industry specific tools, and equipment that they will utilize throughout their careers in the trade	32
<b>CONT163</b>	<b>INDUSTRIAL SEWING MACHINES</b> Participants will be introduced to the industrial sewing machine, and through demonstration and hands on instruction, will become familiar with and proficient in its operation, use, and maintenance /care.	40
<b>CONT190</b>	<b>CONSTRUCTION INTERNSHIP I</b> This course consists of paid OJT, internship, or practicum performed in a business, industry, trade, or technical career setting within the student's occupational area. The contact hours experienced through on-the-job training will be verified by an employer or union official and will be placed on the student's record. There are specific competencies from work experience required.	1800

<b>CONT164</b>	<b>SELECTING FABRICS</b> Participants will be introduced to the fabric selection process based on suitability, fibers, weaving, and strength of fabrics.	<b>40</b>
<b>CONT165</b>	<b>STRIPPING AND REPAIRING FRAMES</b> Participants will be introduced to the proper techniques of stripping off of old fabric and repairing frames and components.	<b>32</b>
<b>CONT166</b>	<b>FINISHING AND REFINISHING</b> Participants will be introduced to the removal of old finishes, application of new finishes, distinguishing various finishes and their characteristics, and methods of repairing defects on finished surfaces.	<b>32</b>
<b>SFTH261</b>	<b>SAFETY FOR UPHOLSTERY WORKERS II</b> This class will emphasize the importance of PPE in working with chemicals. The safe handling and storage of chemicals will also be underscored.	<b>16</b>

<b>MATH160</b>	<b>INTRODUCTORY CONCEPTS OF MATHEMATICS</b> This course covers basic treatment of trade math beginning with general math, fractions, decimals, ratios and percentages. Early layout theory in spacing of framing using linear measurements and quantitative material take-off is introduced.	32
<b>CONT260</b>	<b>INSTALLING FINAL COVERINGS I</b> Participants will be introduced to the intricate task of measuring, laying out, cutting and sewing final coverings for installation.	32
<b>CONT261</b>	<b>INSTALLING FINAL COVERINGS II</b> Participants will be introduced to the installation of final coverings once the layout, cutting, and sewing procedures have been completed.	32
<b>CONT262</b>	<b>CUSHIONS</b> Participants will be introduced to Measuring, creating, and using cushion patterns, cutting and fitting processes, and the sequence of assembly.	32
<b>CONT263</b>	<b>CHANNELING</b> Participants will be introduced to the proper techniques and methods for making and installing channels.	32
<b>CONT264</b>	<b>TUFTING</b> Participants will be introduced to the proper techniques and methods for making and installing tufted seats, backs, and arms.	32
<b>CONT290</b>	<b>CONSTRUCTION INTERNSHIP III</b> This course consists of paid OJT, internship, or practicum performed in a business, industry, trade, or technical career setting within the student's occupational area. <b>MATH161</b>	INTRODUCTORY CONCEPTS OF GEOMETRY This course covers basic treatment of trade geometry beginning with calculating the areas of rectangles, squares and triangles. Early layout theory and pattern making using geometric measurements is introduced.	32
<b>CONT265</b>	GAMING TABLES Participants will be introduced to the commercial/Gaming industry side of Upholstery beginning with the different types of gaming tables.	32
<b>CONT266</b>	SLOT MACHINE STOOLS Participants will be introduced to the various types of slot machine stools and will learn to estimate, pattern and reupholster in a production mindset.	32
<b>CONT267</b>	TABLE GAME CHAIRS Participants will be introduced to the various types of gaming table chairs and will learn to estimate, pattern and reupholster in a production mindset.	32
<b>CONT268</b>	RESTAURANT AND BAR FURNITURE Participants will be introduced to the many different types of restaurant and bar furniture and will learn to estimate, pattern and reupholster in a production mindset.	32
